

Scope of Work
AOA Armor Kit for M1062P1
NSN: 2540-01-542-0356
Semitrailer, Tank Fuel, 7500-Gallon

I. General:

This Scope of Work (SOW) covers the inspection, inventory, refurbishment, and packaging standards for the M1062P1 add on armor kit.

The following technical publications and documents form a part of this scope of work:

TB 9-2330-384-14&P	OPERATOR'S, UNIT, INSTALLATION/REMOVAL INSTRUCTIONS, AND REPAIR PARTS AND SPECIAL TOOLS LIST (RPSTL) FOR TANKER BALLISTIC PROTECTION SYSTEM (TBPS/AOA/FTSS) FOR SEMITRAILER, TANK,FUEL, 7500-GALLON M1062P1
TM 43-0139	PAINTING INSTRUCTIONS FOR ARMY MATERIEL
TB 43-0213	CORROSION PREVENTION AND CONTROL (CPC) FOR TACTICAL VEHICLES

II. Definitions:

1. Refurbishment: Restoring a component to its original performance condition.
2. Serviceable Part: Any part that is capable of meeting or exceeding the minimum standards for performing the function for which it was originally designed.
3. Unserviceable Part: Any part that no longer meets minimum standards.

4. Mandatory Replacement Parts: Parts/components that shall be replaced in each kit that is refurbished. For a listing of mandatory replacement parts, see Appendix A.
5. Complete Kit: All parts/components compiled together to create kit. A listing of all kit parts is found in TB 9-2330-384-14&P.

III. Kit Repair:

1. Description:

Kits in various states of disrepair and completeness will be provided by the US Army (TACOM). You will inspect, inventory, and refurbish the kits adhering to the procedures/standards contained in this SOW and the applicable Technical standards and publications.

2. Inventory and Inspection:

The AOA Kits will be inventoried to verify the shortage list that accompanies each kit. All kit components will be cleaned and inspected for damage, wear and overall serviceability. All mounting hardware can be disposed of. The inventory will be updated to show only serviceable components.

3. Component or Item Requirements

Components that are serviceable will be refurbished to Condition Code: B.

Stencils All required stencils will be in place, serviceable and legible.

Welded Components Welded Components will be free from cracked/broken welds.

Paint (CARC) CARC will not be applied over unprepared surfaces. All rust will be removed and surfaces repaired and primed. Paint surfaces will have good adhesion, be free of rust, bare spots and peeling or flaking. Respirators will be used by personnel. Reference TM 43-0139, Painting Instructions for Army Material and MIL-DTL-53072. Desert Sand color CARC paint as required.

4. Kit components authorized for procurement and procurement of needed components:

a. Kits missing any of the components listed below can be considered complete kits as these components are authorized for procurement as needed. These are NOT mandatory replacement parts. This list does not include the mandatory replacement parts.

b. The contractor shall requisition all National Stock Numbers (NSN) included in the table below as required for replacement. DLA will be the primary source for the majority of the NSN's in the AOA Armor items. A list of quantities can be found in Table 4-1, TB 9-2330-384-14&P. The Depot is authorized to acquire parts for the AOA Armor Kit directly from the vendor if approval is granted from DLA, and the cost does not exceed the price provided by DLA.

5. AOA Kit Building:

Complete Kits will be built by combining components from incomplete kits, parts authorized for procurement, and mandatory replacement parts. A total count of complete kits and a spreadsheet of extra components will be prepared and provided to TACOM.

6. AOA Kit Packaging:

a. The contractor will package all the parts into the main container IAW Mil Std 129. The contractor will group together parts into smaller boxes using a number or letter system inside the main container providing a packing list for all the contents in each box. This will be the standard packaging list used in all subsequent AOA Armor Kits assemblies. A master packing list will be attached to the outside of the main container". The main container should meet or exceed the best commercial packaging standards. Sufficient packing material should be placed inside the main container to prevent boxes shifting during transport. The words AOA ARMOR Kit Mdl: M1062P1 with NSN will be boldly stenciled on all sides of the main container.

b. After the contractor has developed a packaging plan, and a number or letter system, the contractor will demonstrate the plan for final approval by the Integrated Logistics Support Center (ILSC).

c. The contractor will also provide the ILSC with an estimated schedule for the completion of the first AOA ARMOR Kit.

7. Reference:

If there is conflict between this SOW and kit technical publications regarding dimensions or repair part specifications, the SOW will prevail.

IV. Final Inspection/Turn Around: Completed kits will be prepared for storage IAW the applicable equipment packaging data sheet. Inspection will take place at contractors site. Ramp up time will be 10 days, turn around time will be 7 days per kit.

52.212-4 CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS-- COMMERCIAL ITEMS (FEB 2012)

(a) Inspection/Acceptance. The Contractor shall only tender for acceptance those items that conform to the requirements of this contract. The Government reserves the right to inspect or test any supplies or services that have been tendered for acceptance. The Government may require repair or replacement of nonconforming supplies or reperformance of nonconforming services at no increase in contract price. If repair/replacement or reperformance will not correct the defects or is not possible, the Government may seek an equitable price reduction or adequate consideration for acceptance of nonconforming supplies or services. The Government must exercise its post-acceptance rights (1) within a reasonable time after the defect was discovered or should have been discovered; and (2) before any substantial change occurs in the condition of the item, unless the change is due to the defect in the item.

(b) Assignment. The Contractor or its assignee may assign its rights to receive payment due as a result of performance of this contract to a bank, trust company, or other financing institution, including any Federal lending agency in accordance with the Assignment of Claims Act (31 U.S.C. 3727). However, when a third party makes payment (e.g., use of the Governmentwide commercial purchase card), the Contractor may not assign its rights to receive payment under this contract.

(c) Changes. Changes in the terms and conditions of this contract may be made only by written agreement of the parties.

(d) Disputes. This contract is subject to the Contract Disputes Act of 1978, as amended (41 U.S.C. 601-613). Failure of the parties to this contract to reach agreement on any request for equitable adjustment, claim, appeal or action arising under or relating to this contract shall be a dispute to be resolved in accordance with the clause at FAR 52.233-1, Disputes, which is incorporated herein by reference. The Contractor shall proceed diligently with performance of this contract, pending final resolution of any dispute arising under the contract.

(e) Definitions. The clause at FAR 52.202-1, Definitions, is incorporated herein by reference.

(f) Excusable delays. The Contractor shall be liable for default unless nonperformance is caused by an occurrence beyond the reasonable control of the Contractor and without its fault or negligence such as, acts of God or the public enemy, acts of the Government in either its sovereign or contractual capacity, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, strikes, unusually severe weather, and delays of common carriers. The Contractor shall notify the Contracting Officer in writing as soon as it is reasonably possible after the commencement or any excusable delay, setting forth the full particulars in connection therewith, shall remedy such occurrence with all reasonable dispatch and shall promptly give written notice to the Contracting Officer of the cessation of such occurrence.

(g) Invoice.

(1) The Contractor shall submit an original invoice and three copies (or electronic invoice, if authorized) to the address designated in the contract to receive invoices. An invoice must include--

(i) Name and address of the Contractor;

(ii) Invoice date and number;

(iii) Contract number, contract line item number and, if applicable, the order number;

- (iv) Description, quantity, unit of measure, unit price and extended price of the items delivered;
- (v) Shipping number and date of shipment, including the bill of lading number and weight of shipment if shipped on Government bill of lading;
- (vi) Terms of any discount for prompt payment offered;
- (vii) Name and address of official to whom payment is to be sent;
- (viii) Name, title, and phone number of person to notify in event of defective invoice; and
- (ix) Taxpayer Identification Number (TIN). The Contractor shall include its TIN on the invoice only if required elsewhere in this contract.
- (x) Electronic funds transfer (EFT) banking information.
 - (A) The Contractor shall include EFT banking information on the invoice only if required elsewhere in this contract.
 - (B) If EFT banking information is not required to be on the invoice, in order for the invoice to be a proper invoice, the Contractor shall have submitted correct EFT banking information in accordance with the applicable solicitation provision, contract clause (e.g., 52.232-33, Payment by Electronic Funds Transfer--Central Contractor Registration, or 52.232-34, Payment by Electronic Funds Transfer--Other Than Central Contractor Registration), or applicable agency procedures.
 - (C) EFT banking information is not required if the Government waived the requirement to pay by EFT.
- (2) Invoices will be handled in accordance with the Prompt Payment Act (31 U.S.C. 3903) and Office of Management and Budget (OMB) prompt payment regulations at 5 CFR part 1315.
- (h) Patent indemnity. The Contractor shall indemnify the Government and its officers, employees and agents against liability, including costs, for actual or alleged direct or contributory infringement of, or inducement to infringe, any United States or foreign patent, trademark or copyright, arising out of the performance of this contract, provided the Contractor is reasonably notified of such claims and proceedings.
- (i) Payment.--
 - (1) Items accepted. Payment shall be made for items accepted by the Government that have been delivered to the delivery destinations set forth in this contract.
 - (2) Prompt payment. The Government will make payment in accordance with the Prompt Payment Act (31 U.S.C. 3903) and prompt payment regulations at 5 CFR part 1315.
 - (3) Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT). If the Government makes payment by EFT, see 52.212-5(b) for the appropriate EFT clause.
 - (4) Discount. In connection with any discount offered for early payment, time shall be computed from the date of the invoice. For the purpose of computing the discount earned, payment shall be considered to have been made on the date which appears on the payment check or the specified payment date if an electronic funds transfer payment is made.
 - (5) Overpayments. If the Contractor becomes aware of a duplicate contract financing or invoice payment or that the Government has otherwise overpaid on a contract financing or invoice payment, the Contractor shall--

(i) Remit the overpayment amount to the payment office cited in the contract along with a description of the overpayment including the--

(A) Circumstances of the overpayment (e.g., duplicate payment, erroneous payment, liquidation errors, date(s) of overpayment);

(B) Affected contract number and delivery order number, if applicable;

(C) Affected contract line item or subline item, if applicable; and

(D) Contractor point of contact.

(ii) Provide a copy of the remittance and supporting documentation to the Contracting Officer.

(6) Interest.

(i) All amounts that become payable by the Contractor to the Government under this contract shall bear simple interest from the date due until paid unless paid within 30 days of becoming due. The interest rate shall be the interest rate established by the Secretary of the Treasury as provided in Section 611 of the Contract Disputes Act of 1978 (Public Law 95-563), which is applicable to the period in which the amount becomes due, as provided in (i)(6)(v) of this clause, and then at the rate applicable for each six-month period as fixed by the Secretary until the amount is paid.

(ii) The Government may issue a demand for payment to the Contractor upon finding a debt is due under the contract.

(iii) Final decisions. The Contracting Officer will issue a final decision as required by 33.211 if--

(A) The Contracting Officer and the Contractor are unable to reach agreement on the existence or amount of a debt within 30 days;

(B) The Contractor fails to liquidate a debt previously demanded by the Contracting Officer within the timeline specified in the demand for payment unless the amounts were not repaid because the Contractor has requested an installment payment agreement; or

(C) The Contractor requests a deferment of collection on a debt previously demanded by the Contracting Officer (see 32.607-2).

(iv) If a demand for payment was previously issued for the debt, the demand for payment included in the final decision shall identify the same due date as the original demand for payment.

(v) Amounts shall be due at the earliest of the following dates:

(A) The date fixed under this contract.

(B) The date of the first written demand for payment, including any demand for payment resulting from a default termination.

(vi) The interest charge shall be computed for the actual number of calendar days involved beginning on the due date and ending on--

(A) The date on which the designated office receives payment from the Contractor;

(B) The date of issuance of a Government check to the Contractor from which an amount otherwise payable has been withheld as a credit against the contract debt; or

(C) The date on which an amount withheld and applied to the contract debt would otherwise have become payable to the Contractor.

(vii) The interest charge made under this clause may be reduced under the procedures prescribed in 32.608-2 of the Federal Acquisition Regulation in effect on the date of this contract.

(j) Risk of loss. Unless the contract specifically provides otherwise, risk of loss or damage to the supplies provided under this contract shall remain with the Contractor until, and shall pass to the Government upon:

(1) Delivery of the supplies to a carrier, if transportation is f.o.b. origin; or

(2) Delivery of the supplies to the Government at the destination specified in the contract, if transportation is f.o.b. destination.

(k) Taxes. The contract price includes all applicable Federal, State, and local taxes and duties.

(l) Termination for the Government's convenience. The Government reserves the right to terminate this contract, or any part hereof, for its sole convenience. In the event of such termination, the Contractor shall immediately stop all work hereunder and shall immediately cause any and all of its suppliers and subcontractors to cease work. Subject to the terms of this contract, the Contractor shall be paid a percentage of the contract price reflecting the percentage of the work performed prior to the notice of termination, plus reasonable charges the Contractor can demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Government using its standard record keeping system, have resulted from the termination. The Contractor shall not be required to comply with the cost accounting standards or contract cost principles for this purpose. This paragraph does not give the Government any right to audit the Contractor's records. The Contractor shall not be paid for any work performed or costs incurred which reasonably could have been avoided.

(m) Termination for cause. (t) Central Contractor Registration (CCR). In addition, the contractor or his authorized agent will comply with the Occupational Safety and Health Act Parts 1910 and 1926, the U.S. Army Engineer Manual 385-1-1, Army Regulations, Red River Regulations 385-1, and the Uniform Code of Traffic Control Devices.

(c) Each contractor shall have a written contractors safety program and policy. In cases where the subcontractor has a written regulation for its employees, a copy of that regulation will be forwarded to the contractor for forwarding to the Contracting Officer, prior to commencement of work.

(d) Subcontractors and Employees. Each subcontractor shall be considered a contractor employee for purposes of this section.

(e) Warning signs, barricades, and detours. The contractor shall furnish and erect adequate warning signs, flashing lights, and barricades to properly control traffic movements around or through the construction site. The contractor shall provide and maintain any detours or crossovers necessary for the safety and convenience of traffic.

(f) Contractor and Employee Vehicles. Contractor vehicles must meet with current state safety regulations and an appropriate sticker affixed in the lower left corner of the windshield. Vehicles not meeting the state safety codes will not be allowed on RRAD. Those which have a safety inspection expire while on RRAD will be removed and properly recertified NLT 15 days prior to the expiration date. Vehicles found to be out of inspection date will be ordered off of the depot and the contractor decal removed. Vehicles found by RRAD Safety personnel to be unsafe for RRAD operations will be brought to the attention of the contractor who will either repair the vehicle or remove it.

(g) Contractors are responsible for their employees' conduct and their vehicles. Employees with unsafe vehicles will be required to remove them from RRAD until they can be repaired.

(h) Accidents, other than minor first aid injuries, should be reported to the COR and/or Contract Administrator who will inform Safety as appropriate. These are reportable on a Department of Army Form 285 when they occur on U.S. Federal property. .

(i) The Contracting Officer will notify the contractor in writing of any observed non-compliance with the foregoing provisions. The contractor shall, after receipt of such notice, immediately take corrective action. The Safety Manager may make direct contact with a contractor or his authorized representative for conditions of imminent danger to life or U.S. Government property. In such cases, the Contracting Officer will be immediately notified. In cases which have the potential for embarrassment to the U.S. Government, or Red River Army Depot, the Contracting Officer will notify the contractor verbally to be followed up by a written report of the situation and the action to be taken to correct it. If the contractor fails or refuses to promptly take corrective action, the Contracting Officer will issue an order stopping all or part of the work until satisfactory corrective action has been taken. No part of the time lost due to such stop orders will be made the subject of a claim for extension of time or for excess costs or damages by the contractor unless it was later determined that the contractor was in compliance.

H2. INSURANCE (Fixed Price Contract)

Pursuant to the requirements of the contract clause titled "Insurance-Work on a Government Installation", the contractor shall obtain and maintain at least the following kinds of insurance and minimum liability coverage during any period of contract performance:

a. Workmen's Compensation and occupational disease coverage as required by law except that, if this contract is to be performed in a state which does not require or permit private insurance, then compliance with the statutory or administrative requirements in any such state will be satisfactory. b. Comprehensive General Liability Insurance in the minimum limit of \$500,000 per occurrence for bodily injury liability.

c. Comprehensive Automotive Liability Insurance with minimum limits of \$200,000 per person and \$500,000 per occurrence for bodily injury, and a minimum limit of \$20,000 per occurrence for property damage.

L2. AMC-Level Protest Program

If you have complaints about this procurement, it is preferable that you first attempt to resolve those concerns with the responsible contracting officer. However, you can also protest to Headquarters, AMC. The HQAMC-Level Protest Program is intended to encourage interested parties to seek resolution of their concerns within AMC as an Alternative Dispute Resolution forum, rather than filing a protest with the Government Accountability Office or other external forum. Contract award or performance is suspended during the protest to the same extent, and within the same time periods, as if filed at the GAO. The AMC protest decision goal is to resolve protests within 20 working days from filing. To be timely, protests must be filed within the periods specified in FAR 33.103. If you want to file a protest under the HQAMC-Level Protest Program, the protest must request resolution under that program and be sent to the address below. All other agency-level protests should be sent to the contracting officer for resolution.
